# Geographers take to the Lake District

40 keen geographers recently visited Patterdale Hall in the Lake District to complete geography fieldwork.

The students from Year 8, 9 and 12 took measurements in a river to identify whether it was a true representation of how textbooks describe them. The river was very cold due to melting snow, but students were superb, completing the data collection very efficiently. They then assessed human geography around the local village, Glenridding, before taking part in some group activities such as canoeing and egg rocketing.
