Covid Outbreak Contingency Plan – Information for Parents & Carers Sept. 2021

When should my child self-isolate or miss school?	<ul> <li>All pupils MUST attend school unless they are ill.</li> <li>From 16<sup>th</sup> August 2021, children under 18 years 6 months (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a close contact has Covid.</li> <li>Instead, they are advised to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at home</u> and should book a PCR test), <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow test.</li> <li>If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test.</li> <li>If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 years 6 months or fully vaccinated – but you are advised to book a PCR test.</li> <li>NHS Test &amp; Trace will contact you to identify close contacts of your child.</li> <li>Remote learning will be provided for your child to complete if they are well enough.</li> </ul>

Few School Cases.	<ul> <li>There have been few cases of Covid within school.</li> <li>Cases of Covid locally are low and / or stable.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Covid measures in school:</li> <li>Reminding pupils of good hand-hygiene.</li> <li>Ensuring good ventilation where practical.</li> <li>Ensuring pupils &amp; staff stay at home if they have Covid symptoms (and book a PCR test).</li> <li>Staff and pupils are encouraged to continue to test themselves at home using Lateral Flow tests until the end of September.</li> </ul>

5 pupils (or 10%)	<ul> <li>There have been 5 cases of Covid across a year group within 10 days.</li> <li>10% of pupils within a small group (e.g. social group, extra-curricular</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The school will review existing measures and discuss the outbreak with Northumberland Director of Public Health.</li> <li>Enhanced protective measures may be introduced, including:         <ul> <li>Re-introducing face coverings for corridors &amp; communal areas.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>Reverting to assemblies in classrooms via Teams.</li> </ul>
• Covid cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10 day period.	Despite the measures indicated above, Covid cases within the school continue to rise within a 10 day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that Covid is spreading widely throughout the school.	<ul> <li>The Director of Public Health may agree further measures, including: <ul> <li>Twice-weekly on-site testing in school.</li> <li>Further limiting of school events and visits.</li> <li>Limiting all non-essential visitors to school.</li> </ul> </li> <li>In exceptional cases, re-introducing remote learning for individual classes for 10 school days will be considered.</li> </ul>
