Fieldwork fun

Our GCSE geographers completed a day of fieldwork at Blyth Beach earlier this term.

The group spent the day taking measurements to evaluate the effect of the sea defences at Blyth on the natural profile of the beach, investigating if the theory we had been learning was a true reflection of the processes at play on Blyth Beach.

They assessed the impact of the wooden groynes, measuring the sediment build up on both the north and south sides of the groynes, they then measured the distribution and size of the pebbles and the angles of the beach at a

number of intervals before analysing the wave type and frequencies and processes taking place along the coastline.

After a busy morning students refuelled with fish and chips and ice cream before walking along to the north end of Seaton Sluice Beach to compare an area which has soft engineering strategies. We're sure all students would agree that it was fantastic to gain some normality again and get out to see the theory in practice.
