Bedlington Sixth Form scientists win awards

Earlier this term, five of our sixth form students attended the *Bring It On* science fair to present their research projects for the regional *Big-Bang-Fair* competition.

Over the summer, Muzghan Wazir, Jack Whinnom, Megan Goss, Cameron Arkle and Kieron Robson participated in post-graduate research projects at local universities through an initiative run by the Nuffield Foundation. As part of the programme, they presented their research projects to judges so they could be considered for awards.

All five students were presented with certificates from the Nuffield Foundation for completing the programme. Three of the students also received awards from the judging panel.

Cameron was awarded the innovation prize for his project about the application of positive psychological therapies to help treat people living with lower limb amputations. Jack was awarded the resilience prize for his project about water chemistry in a fjord fed by a glacier in west Greenland.

Megan was awarded for her project about dye-sensitised solar-cells and has become one of the ten finalists who qualify to compete at the *Big Bang UK Young Scientist and Engineers* competition in March 2019. We'll let you know how she gets on - watch this space.

Well done to all five students who took part.

Best exam results ever

At GCSE, 1 in 4 grades were awarded at Grade 6 (B) or higher and we had a 13% increase in the proportion of students achieving strong passes in GCSE English.

We also had outstanding progress in science, languages, music, IT, creative media, construction, engineering, food and health and social care.

Eight students achieved at least five 9-7 grades and over 40% of students achieved at least one top grade. The proportion of 9-7 grades (A*-A) doubled from the previous year.

Well done to everyone who tried their best and to our wonderful staff who go above and beyond to help students reach their full potential.

Year 10 students, Phoebe Taylor-Walker and Aleysha Harness, went to Gateshead College last month to compete in the local finals of the *Future Chef* competition.
