Hello Norway!

The North Sea Link is a 720 kilometre subsea interconnector linking the electricity systems of the UK and Norway, stretching from Blyth, across the North Sea, to Kvilldal in Norway.

Our geography students in 7A1 have spent some time this term looking at the North Sea Link and the benefits it brings to the local area and the UK as a whole. However, its all very well looking at the actual links and the process but what is actually at the other end?

We spent a morning exploring what was at the other side by linking up with Vinjar school in Norway. Students in grade 6 and 7 at Vinjar put together some videos and presentations for our students to tell them about Norway and the lives that they have there.

Our students then produced some presentations about life in England and Bedlington and to show what this end of the interconnector looked like.

Students then delivered their presentations 'live' to the students who were waiting to eagerly hear them in Vinjar school. The morning was a great success!
