SIXTH FORMERS VISIT CAMBRIDGE

Seven students from Ashington and Bedlington Academy sixth forms attended an aspirational trip to King's College in Cambridge earlier this year.

After a lengthy journey to Cambridge, the students were immediately immersed into the medieval beauty of King's College. After talks about undergraduate life from current students, they were given a tour of the college including the famous King's College Chapel.

Students attended workshop sessions the next day. Those interested in arts were introduced to classical studies and had a taster session, comparing the democracy of Ancient Greece with the current political issue of Brexit.

Students who were interested in science took part in a lecture on the application of magnetic resonance imagery (MRI) and developing understanding of Alzheimer's and drug treatments. Further workshops looked at the application of coding and applying linguistic research to child development, brain injuries and regional dialects.

Students had meals in the halls of residence and were able to enjoy the social facilities of the common room. Application of angles was in evidence in keenly contested pool games after an evening walk taking in the sights of the university town

The time spent in Cambridge enabled our students to reflect on which universities they would wish to apply for and allowed them to gain valuable knowledge on making a successful application. Students were impressed at the environment and aspirational impact of their experience.

The students were invited to attend *School Physicist of the Year* events to celebrate and reward their achievements in science.

The students attended lectures and met undergraduates currently studying physics at university, as well as taking part in hands-on science demonstrations.

The Ogden Trust aims to increase the uptake of physics at post-16, particularly

for those from underrepresented groups. The Trust supports schools, projects, and programmes that are committed to enhancing physics teaching and learning.

Bedlington Academy is now a partner school with The Ogden Trust and works closely with the NUSTEM programme at Northumbria University to engage students with STEM learning and careers.

OUTSTANDING NELT NEWS!

As you know, our school is a member of the North East Learning Trust - a family of eight schools across North East England. This term, one of our Trust schools, Teesdale School and Sixth Form, was rated as 'outstanding' by school inspectors Ofsted - the highest accolade a school can achieve.

Teesdale was previously rated as 'requiring improvement' in its last inspection and has dramatically improved to become outstanding in just three years.

The report highlighted the positive impact that being part of the Trust has had on the
